*Join us for the Rollins College screening of the documentary REDLIGHT and meet Cambodian Activist Mu Sochua*

"RedLight", is the second in a trilogy of documentary films by director Guy Jacobson to expose the horrors of global child trafficking. Narrated by UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador Lucy Liu, the powerful film depicts the struggle against child exploitation led by human rights advocates Somaly Mam and Mu Sochua, both of whom have dedicated their lives to ending human trafficking.

Using gritty footage smuggled out of brothels and harrowing testimonials, REDLIGHT follows the plight of several current and former child sex slaves. Some are trying to regain entry into Cambodian society to find some semblance of normality after their horrific experiences. Other stories highlight the plight of victims who are attempting to bring the perpetrators to justice. Their torturous yet ultimately heroic battles to find witnesses and take brothel owners to court are dramatically brought to life in this topical and moving feature documentary.

Cambodian parliamentarian Mu Sochua, Nobel Peace Prize nominee, is a tireless advocate who is contesting a recent court decision that threatens her right to speak out in defense of equal rights, transparency and a fair judicial process.

*The film will be shown at the **Suntust Auditorium** on **Saturday, April 16** at 2 pm. Following the screening, Mu Sochua will speak about her work in Cambodia.*
